

















Many of the day trippers leave trash near their vehicles that destroys the beach and marsh, and it is the homeowners that end up going to pick it all up so that we can protect the place where we live. There is no accountability for those not following Holden Beach rules already, so now when these new lots fill up because it draws even more people, they will still continue to park on the street illegally or on private owners driveways when those new lots are filled. This will not fix the problem of people trying to park illegally. Many day trip parking visitors already show that they are not willing to follow Holden Beach rules, so if the new lots are full, they will continue to push and break the rules. We will just end up with the need for more parking and a beach that no longer resembles the Holden we love. We need to be able to trust that our elected representatives will represent us that live on Holden Beach, and will listen to our concerns before making decisions that affect those who live on the island. We do not need arbitrarily made decisions that will forever change the course of this beach as well as not actually fix the problem, but instead will create an even bigger problem. Have you ever seen the movie Field of Dreams and know the line "if you build it they will come?" Our barrier island does not have the infrastructure to hold the people for the road that this course of action will take us down. Another question I have is how are these people in these new lots going to funnel to the accesses? They will try to walk through wherever they can. They already do that now with no consequence. What is Holden Beach's next step, add more public walkway access? May not seem like a big deal to most, but picture your own house that you purchased and now live in, and someone decides after the fact to add a parking lot in front of it (with people coming and going all day long) or decides to add a walkway in between you and your neighbor's yard. Holden Beach elected officials are not telling us their next step, which possibly could be to make more public access walkways. It is one thing if you bought your house knowing you have an existing access or parking lot next to it and the value of your house is priced accordingly, but it is another when you already live there and all of this is added and immediately changes your home in monetary value. Many may think that the effects of this new proposal will not impact them, but the new parking will forever change the beautiful natural areas that people love about Holden. These changes will have negative future impacts that will affect all people who live on or visit Holden Beach. The negatives from this proposal will far outweigh the very shortsighted fix that the commissioners feel will be gained by these new parking lots. There are so many people that complain about other beaches that are so crowded, congested, and trashy and that they can't enjoy it, so why would anyone want to do the same to Holden? Renters will not place the same value on coming here anymore. They will search for another "family beach" and Holden will succumb to becoming another overcrowded area that feels like a little Myrtle Beach, Panama City Beach, or Daytona Beach. They are known as "day trip parking" beaches. Many of the other surrounding NC beaches have slowly faded into this type of beach as well. Once family centered beaches that were also concerned about preserving and taking care of their beach environment have now allowed mass parking and "improvements" that have ultimately destroyed and changed their beaches forever. Progress doesn't have to come at the cost of destroying our family beach that owners and renters are blessed to enjoy. Progress can mean thinking outside of the box. Being different from the expected and allowing all ideas and suggestions to be thoroughly researched before making any decisions. For example, instead of creating crowded parking lots with porta johns, create parking areas on the main land near other commercial areas in which people can catch a shuttle over to the beach. At the new mobile home areas, have a shuttle service, at their expense, that runs during the day for the convenience of those who would like to visit the beach. This would be a new service that would actually create jobs in the Supply/Holden Beach area. If you must use our tax payer money, use it to start up a transportation service for those wanting to visit the beach that are staying off the island. Reimbursement from funds needed for start up of the new service would be paid back by the transportation fees paid by the people using the service. Holden Beach vans could be purchased for transportation or even go to a Holden Beach Uber type service in which employees use their own vehicle and are paid for using their gas and service time. 



The town is currently under contract to purchase the pier and building/parking lot for \$3.25M. The purchase will be paid for with a loan that will potentially increase taxes. Basically, the pier structure is beyond its expected service life and has critical safety issues that need urgent repair – estimated to cost between \$500,000 and \$750,000. No diving inspection was performed, only tactile inspections were performed on the pilings in water less than five feet deep. The pier building is essentially a tear-down except for maybe a portion on the west end. Read the reports here: Engineering Report, Building Inspector's Report, and the Pier Due Diligence Inspection. 




Golf cart regulations and their enforcement is sufficient




Additional golf cart regulations are needed




Additional enforcement is needed of existing golf cart rules






